From the CEO's Desk Syed Aneesuddin Chief Executive Officer, Sahayata Trust



2024 was a year that reminded us of the immense strength of humanity's collective will and compassion. At Sahayata Trust, we witnessed lives transformed, dreams realized, and hope restored, proving that even in moments of challenge, the light of service can guide us to a better tomorrow. As Rabindranath Tagore once wrote, "I slept and dreamt that life was joy. I awoke and saw that life was service. I acted, and behold, service was joy." This year, we embraced that joy and shared it with those who needed it most.

It was also a year of profound loss. India bid farewell to two extraordinary leaders—Ratan Tata and Dr. Manmohan Singh. Their unparalleled contributions and commitment to building a stronger, more compassionate India will continue to inspire us. At Sahayata Trust, we honor their legacy by striving to nurture a generation of individuals who, like them, will give back to this great country with purpose and pride.

Among our many milestones, we celebrated the first anniversary of the Indo-US Hospital in Tolichowki, which broke even within six months—a testament to the resilience of our vision. Inspired by this success, we have set our sights on establishing a Neonatal Intensive Care Unit at the hospital in Tolichowki. We also inaugurated The Manchi School in Balapur, furthering our mission of providing quality education to underserved communities.

This year, over 24,426 lives were touched through our educational initiatives, with 22 institutions supported and 1,300 scholarships awarded. Through *Code for India*, underprivileged youth received free coding education, equipping them with skills for the digital age. At *Edventure Park*, startups were incubated by young students from disadvantaged backgrounds, sowing seeds of innovation and enterprise.

In healthcare, we provided over 10,000 free dialysis sessions in collaboration with the *Bhagwan Mahavir Jain Relief Foundation Trust*. To state a milestone in the Ophthalmology Department at the *Indo-US Hospital, in Malakpet*, between October and December alone, 1,000 free cataract surgeries were performed at Indo-US Malakpet in partnership with *Pushpagiri Vitreo Retina Institute*, restoring the precious gift of sight. We also treated 43,000 individuals at free clinics across India from Uttar Pradesh to Jharkhand. We also continued our CSR collaboration with *Tech Mahindra* with the Science Academy and ambulance services.

Our hunger relief programs distributed over 11 million meals, while our emergency response efforts reached over 9,200 individuals affected by natural disasters in Bihar. Whether it was rebuilding homes for fire victims or providing blankets to the homeless during harsh winters, every act of service reaffirmed our belief in the power of solidarity.

None of these accomplishments would have been possible without the support of our partners, staff and donors. You have shown that compassion can move mountains, and hope can illuminate even the darkest paths.

As we step into 2025, we carry with us the spirit of those we have lost, the courage of those we have served, and the promise of those we are yet to reach. Let us continue to build an India where every life matters, every dream is nurtured, and every individual is empowered to give back to their community and their country.

To help the target population, Sahayata Trust has set up educational institutions and healthcare facilities for the poor. Beyond these activities, Sahayata Trust implemented several programs, including a feeding program, ration distribution, winter relief efforts, and support for orphans, widows, and individuals facing emergency situations.



EDUCATION

At Sahayata Trust, we understand that education is the foundation for personal and societal growth. This year, we continued to invest in education through a variety of initiatives, including our schools, colleges, and skill development centres, all designed to empower students with the knowledge and skills needed to thrive in today's world.

We provide scholarships to deserving students, while our schools emphasise modern teaching techniques, co-curricular activities, vocational training, and holistic education.

In our skill centres, students excel in technical courses such as paramedical training, mobile repair, AC/refrigerator repair, data entry operations, and CCTV installation.

This year, our incubation centres have achieved significant success, helping startups secure seed funding. With over 248 startups incubated, we have built a thriving ecosystem for emerging businesses.

Additionally, we provide salary support and training to around 712 teachers and staff, ensuring their continued growth and contribution to quality education.





HEALTHCARE

Many Indians avoid hospitals due to lack of money. The growing costs of healthcare make it difficult for the poor to access medical facilities, leading to many health concerns. To make healthcare accessible to such people, Sahayata Trust **started various healthcare programs and initiatives.**

With one year of operations at our Indo-US Multispeciality Hospital in Tolichowki, we continue to provide quality healthcare. The **hospital operated at 100% occupancy**, with our dedicated staff working tirelessly to meet the community's needs, exemplifying our commitment to accessible and compassionate care.

The Indo-US Multispeciality Hospital in Malakpet provides **free cataract surgeries**, performing **up to 10 procedures each day**. Our hospitals deliver high-quality, multispecialty healthcare with a focus on **affordability**, **accessibility**, **and compassion**.

Featuring a specialized Glaucoma Center, free dialysis services, and expert doctors across 22+ specialties, we provide comprehensive care under one roof.

Indo-US Hospital, Tolichowki, is introducing a **Neonatal Intensive Care Unit** (**NICU**) to provide specialised care for mothers and their newborns in January 2025, addressing the needs of the community.

This year, we successfully distributed over 11 million meals, providing nourishment and hope to countless individuals and families in need. Through this initiative, our goal was not only to offer sustenance but also to foster a strong sense of community, generosity, and solidarity.

Each meal shared represented a collective act of compassion, strengthening the bonds among us all, especially with the most vulnerable. Together, we continue to make a lasting impact, ensuring that no one is left behind during times of hardship.

Every month, approximately **25,000+ nourishing meals are distributed** across Hyderabad and other cities in India to support vulnerable individuals and families. This equates to **800 to 1000 meals se rved daily.**

Every month, around **25,000 nourishing** meals are distributed across Hyderabad and other cities of India to support vulnerable individuals and families.

During Ramadan, the trust provides hygienic, warm meals for those breaking their fast.

Thoughtfully prepared dessert packets are distributed during Festival celebrations, adding a sweet touch to the festivities.

The feeding program is Sahayata Trust's initiative to ensure people don't go to bed hungry. Under this program, cooked meals and groceries are provided to the needy



Winter Relief in Uttar Pradesh:

In December 2024, Western Uttar Pradesh faced a harsh winter, with temperatures dropping below 5°C, creating severe conditions for the underprivileged, especially those without shelter or warm clothing.

Sahayata Trust launched a winter relief initiative, recognizing the immense challenges faced by homeless individuals and vulnerable communities during the extreme cold.

A total of 1,425 blankets were distributed across five areas in Western UP: Issapur Khugyan, Jhinjhana, Baghpat, Kandhla, and Saharanpur, providing warmth to those in need.

The blankets were given to homeless individuals, slum dwellers, and others living without proper shelter, ensuring they had protection against the freezing temperatures.

The winter relief initiative had a significant impact, offering warmth, comfort, and a sense of dignity to thousands of people during one of the most difficult seasons of the year.


Sahayata Trust expresses their gratitude to donors and volunteers, whose generosity made a meaningful difference, helping individuals survive the harsh winter with hope and support.

India is one of the most disaster-prone countries in the world. The country's geographical features render it vulnerable to many natural hazards such as cyclones, drought, floods, earthquakes, fire, landslides and avalanches. Natural disasters and pandemics take a toll on the economy and the population's health.

Sahayata Trust's emergency relief team visits the affected areas and provides relief and rehabilitation to the victims by distributing warm meals, grocery, and hygiene kits. The teams also rehabilitate those affected by repairing/building homes and re-establishing small businesses.

Emergency Relief Milestone 2024:

- 9,200+ beneficiaries got relief packages
- 2 states were directly affected by flooding and received aid
- **3 400+** food kits distributed to those impacted by the fires in Bihar.

Emergency Relief for Khaari Basaul Fire Victims:

On May 1, 2024, a devastating gas cylinder fire in Khaari Basaul village, Bihar, destroyed over 100 homes, leaving many families, including daily wage earners and widows, homeless.

- Immediate Relief: 100 food and hygiene kits were quickly distributed to the affected families.
- **Ongoing Support**: A damage assessment survey is currently underway to plan long-term rehabilitation efforts.

We responded to floods in Uttarakhand, Bihar, Assam, Gujarat, and Jharkhand, providing food, shelter, and other essential supplies.

Our mission is to ensure that families are able to rebuild their lives and regain access to essential resources as quickly as possible.



Flash Flood Relief in Supaul District, Bihar:

On September 28, 2024, a flash flood struck Supaul District, Bihar, displacing families and causing significant damage to the area.

Sahayata Trust teams quickly mobilized, reaching the affected villages to provide timely relief to the impacted communities.

Grocery packets were distributed to 300 families, benefiting around 1,500 individuals with food and essential supplies for a month.

The relief efforts focused on the worst-hit villages, including Bela, Bageba, Nakta, Bandh, Bhawanipur, and Musahri, ensuring immediate support reached those in direnced.

The distribution of supplies was crucial, helping families survive during the challenging period and alleviating some of their immediate hardships.

Sahayata Trust's prompt intervention brought hope and stability to the affected communities, supporting them on their long journey to recovery.
